Q1. Take a large A3 sheet or chart paper. Draw a **vertical flowchart** showing the sequence of organs involved in digestion. At each step, draw or paste a small image of the organ. Below each organ, write **SCIENCE** 3-4 points explaining its function (you can decorate with arrows, colors, and stickers to make it creative). Q2. Explore acids and bases using natural indicators **Instructions:** Prepare natural indicators like turmeric, beetroot juice, or red cabbage extract. Test household items (lemon juice, soap water, vinegar, baking soda solution, etc.) and record color changes. Make a chart: Item Tested | Indicator Used | Acid/Base | Color Change Q3. Using the knowledge of acids and bases, write a secret message with the help of baking soda and beet root. Explain how it works. (Hint: Prepare baking soda solution in water. Use this solution to write the message on a sheet of white paper with a cotton bud. Rub a slice of fresh beet root over the message.) Q4. Visit a doctor and find out: (i) Under what conditions does a patient need to be on a drip of glucose? (ii) Till when does a patient need to be given glucose? (iii) How does glucose help the patient recover? Write the answers on A4 size sheet. 1. Project Work (Choose One): Prepare a 4–6 page project on any one of the following topics: 1.1 Ancient Indian Kingdoms Choose one (e.g., Mauryan Empire, Gupta Dynasty) **SOCIAL**
